We ask that you do not proceed to your child's class.



The Boys fought hard at their first three tournaments this season achieving 2nd place at the Glen Avon tournament, taking 5th place at the FG Miller tournament, and 2nd at the Mallaig tournament.

The final tournament of the volleyball season, the SPAA Championships, were held Nov 20, 2023 on our home court. 






What is a Catholic school?

Leadership 9 Update

This year, we have a new Leadership CTF course in grade 9. Every grade 9 student will take the Leadership class for one semester. The goal of this course is to provide students with the opportunity to have a positive impact on the lives of others while developing personal leadership skills.

In Term 1, we applied for and received a grant from United Way's *Make Your Mark* program. This initiative educates students on empathy, social issues, and students' ability to be leaders who can make a difference in their community at any age. United Way provides guidance



and funding of up to \$1,000 to project teams to help develop and execute projects addressing poverty.

Our project this year is called Dignity in a Bag. Term 1 students decided to make toiletry bags to give to the Mannawanis Centre to help those in need. The students decided what to put in the bags and created a

budget. We have already had a trip to the local Dollar Tree, where students purchased items for the bags and assembled 50 bags. Term 2 students will finish the bags and deliver them to the Mannawannis Centre before Christmas.

Seeing the students' dedication to this project and their growth in understanding poverty has been

remarkable. I would like to thank the students involved for their hard work. Thank you to Mrs. Belland, our Together We're Better Mental Health Capacity Building program manager, for her help in this project.
