



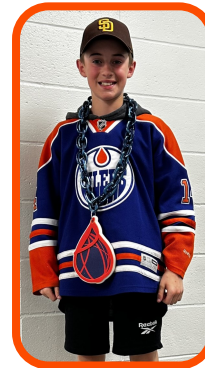

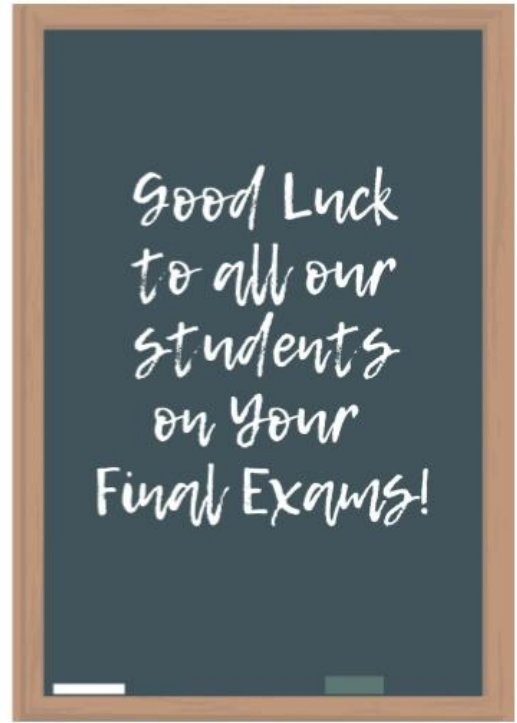

- Use the washroom before exams
- Textbooks must be returned to the library before exams. All markings should be erased prior to handing in to alleviate damage costs.
- Absolutely NO talking during exams
- No electronic devices: ipods, ipads, cell phones, smart watches, games etc.

Parents - please note:

- ❖ If your child is ill, please contact the office first thing in the morning.
- ❖ Missed final exams will be made up to June 20th (12 pm) for grades 6 & 9 and June 23rd (12 pm) for grades 7 & 8.
- ❖ With parent's permission, after the scheduled exam time, students are allowed to leave the school only if they have no other exams to complete or assignments to be completed. This applies the afternoon of June 17th (and afterwards) for Gr. 7-9 students and on June 19th and afterwards for Gr. 6 students.
- ❖ If you wish to EXCUSE your child from the scheduled afternoon review periods, please use the **SCHOOL MESSENGER** attendance app. This can be done ahead of time. A written note will also be accepted.
- ❖ Students will **NOT be allowed to call home** for permission to leave the school.
- ❖ Students remaining in school will not be allowed to roam the hallways. They will be expected to attend scheduled review classes.
- ❖ A reminder that grade 9 students enrolled in Google Productivity Pro through summer school will have time to work on the course assignments starting the afternoon of June 19th (after final exams).

Study Skills 101




Studying for final exams can be challenging—here are some tips and tricks to help you rock your exams!

1. Space it out! 


Don't try to cram all your studying into one night. It is better to study a little bit each day.

6. Use Examples

Think of examples to explain ideas to help you make connections between course content and the real world.





2. Practice Retrieving important information

Try to recall big ideas without looking at your notes! 


7. Quiz yourself and check your answers

8. Break down tasks and set goals for yourself


9. Minimize distractions- Put away our cell phone!!! 

3. Interleaving 


Switch between topics and subjects. Don't just focus on one area you need to study.

4. Elaborating 

When studying a topic, try to explain it, and write down what you know/learn about it.


5. Dual Coding 

Study by both writing and DRAWING to help your brain remember




Take an exercise break while studying! 

It helps:


- increase oxygen to your brain
- improve your focus
- reduce stress
- boost memory



Brain boosting snacks

- Bananas 
- berries 
- nuts and seeds
- oats
- whole wheat toast
- greek yogurt
- cheese and crackers
- hard boiled eggs
- water! 

Avoid sugary snacks and drinks

If you struggle with focus during exams, try these tips! 

- Pick a spot with fewer distractions
- Chunk the test- focus on one page at a time
- Do the easy stuff first
- Take silent stretch breaks - wiggle your toes, take three deep breaths, etc.
- Use your pencil to stay engaged- circle, make notes, underline
- Eat a healthy snack to fuel your brain and drink water

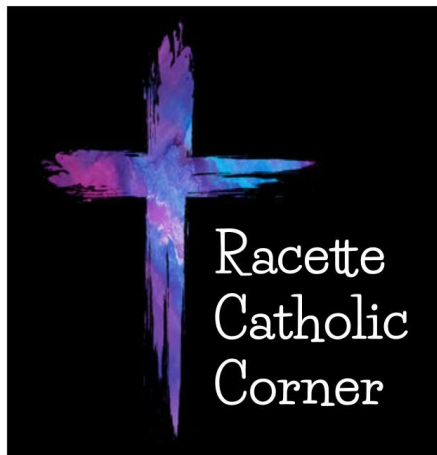

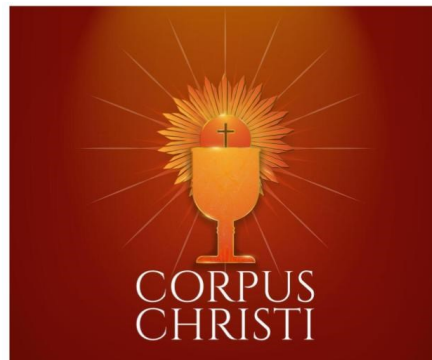
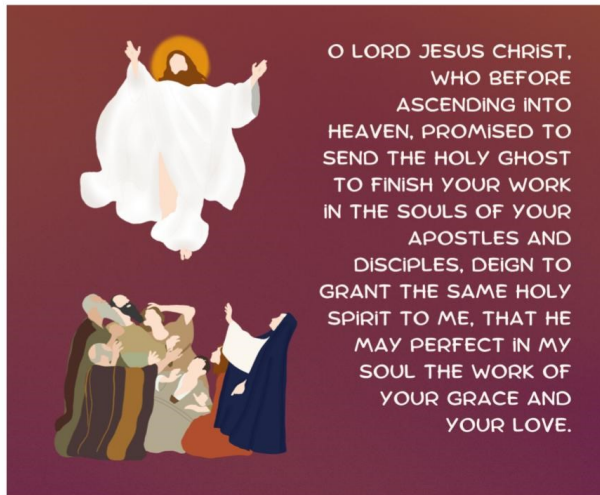
- ~ celebrates the Holy Spirit coming to the disciples

Here we are coming up to the end of the year! As students move through year-end activities and exams, I am wrapping up mental health programming. Here are a few things I have been working on.

1. I am finishing up presentations on **Exam Stress**. I wish students the best as they go into their final exams.
2. I have finished up the Words Stick program with all of the students. I am hopeful that this has raised the level of kindness in our school.
3. School may be coming to an end, but did you know that **our program runs all year long?** We will be providing programming at **Floating Stone campsite July 8th-11th** and at **Lac Bellevue campsite July 29th to Aug 1st**. Each day will run from 9am to noon (weather dependent). This is drop-in programming that is aimed at children and youth aged 6-12yo, but open to everyone.
4. We also have a **Teen Day Camp at Racette from August 5th-8th**. This is for 13yo+ We are having **an Art Day, a STEM Day, a Music Day and a Food Day**.

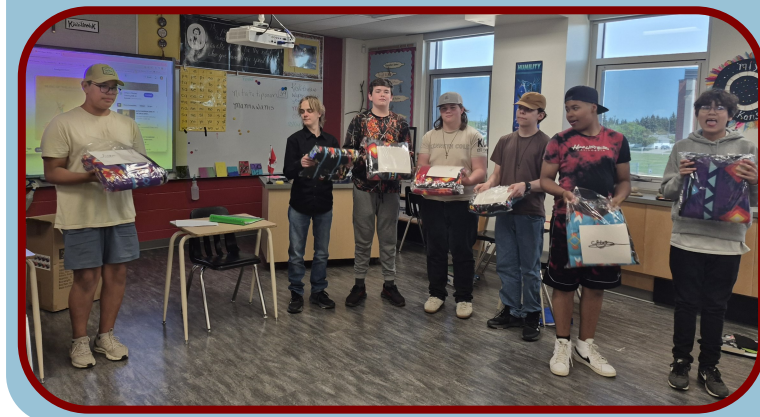
